What the Council does

Allotments

The Council operates allotment sites at Hill Drive. There is currently a waiting list due to the closure of the Moor Lane Allotment Site.

Cemetery

The Town Cemetery is on The Banks and has burial plots, a Garden of Rest and a Memorial Tower, Plots can be reserved in some areas. Contact the Town Clerk for details.

Civic Functions and Duties

The Town Mayor has represented the Council at various civic functions in Nottinghamshire and Lincolnshire and has attended events organised by local clubs and organisations in Bingham. The Town Council makes annual Civic Awards to local people who have made considerable contributions to the community and these are presented at a Civic Reception held each February. The Council holds an annual Civic Service and all residents are welcome to attend.

Events and Promotion

The Council is responsible for the organisation of the Bingham Festival and Town Fair, Carol singing, Festive Window competition, Christmas lighting display and the display of Hanging Baskets in summer. The Council publishes the Bingham Town News, delivered to every household with the Buttercross each month.

Old Court House

The building is fully accessible for the disabled and houses the Council Offices, Council Chamber, Committee rooms and the Register Office. Other offices are let to provide an income to help cover the costs of maintenance.

The building is now licensed to hold Civil Ceremonies - weddings, partnership and citizenship ceremonies - and is the only location in Bingham to offer this facility.

Play Areas

Play equipment is provided and maintained by the Council at Carnarvon play area, Crow Close and Wychwood Road. There is a teen play area at Wynhill. These areas are now all fully accessible in accordance with the Disability Discrimination act. A new play area just off Swallow Drive/Grantham Road is being progressed and the preparation of the necessary legal paperwork for transferring the land to Bingham Town Council is underway.

Sports Fields

The Council maintains sports fields at Butt Field and Wynhill. Following the recent funding applications a wind turbine is to be installed on Butt Field Sports Ground. This has been grant funded by Low Carbon Building Programme, Community Sustainable Energy Programme, Scottish Power and County Councillor Martin Suthers.

Town Centre

The Council works in partnership with Rushcliffe Borough Council and Nottinghamshire County Council to enhance the appearance of the town centre and to attempt to solve the traffic and parking problems. The Council has provided a CCTV system in the Market Square and Eaton Place precinct.

Foreword

As we go forward this year we are better placed to deal with ongoing issues but recent economic restraints have impacted on the Town Council's plans.

The search for land for a Community Centre and additional allotments which would be attainable within the current budget limitations continues.

A new play area to the south of Grantham Road has been identified and work will start imminently on this 'Wallenfels' Play Area including play equipment which is suitable for the less able youngsters in our community.

An interactive speed sign is in place on Nottingham Road as is the Toucan crossing nearby. Going forward, we continue to lobby the County Council for road improvements and to manage congestion in our town and also to implement the planned crossing on Grantham Road.

Finance was set aside from previous developments within the Town for widening the bridge and extending the footpath on Tithby Road and these have been completed.

Discussions and much consultation has taken place on several development proposals, including the possibility of a large store coming to the north of Bingham and with the Crown Estate regarding their plans for additional housing and employment in the north too. A major disappointment has been the failure to secure a new Health Centre but we will actively support the Primary Care Trust to begin anew with this much needed project for Bingham.

The Butt Field Sports Pavilion has been completed and work will continue over the next few years to improve the playing surfaces. Work will also take place to assist the Rugby Club with improvements to the Town Pavilion on Wynhill.

We achieved a place in the final four in our category in the Best Kept Village Competition and as the Summer and Christmas Fairs expand and improve they are attracting many visitors to our Town.

The recently published Town Guide is packed with information and the format for the Bingham Town News has been enhanced to give timelier Council News in line with the schedule for Council Meetings.

Our Town Clerk achieved the necessary gualifications for the Council to be re-accredited with Quality Council status and our thanks are due to all the office staff and ground staff for their hard work and dedication.

It is a privilege to serve as Mayor again and to promote Bingham with the help and support of your Councillors.
