01 Report of the Promotions Working Group

(a) Town News

The Town Council was seeking to align the publication of the Town News more with the calendar of meetings. It was intended to produce at least six issues per year, or more if necessary. It was

RECOMMENDED that the Town News should be published in at least six issues and be available for consultation if necessary.

(b) Town Fair

The Chairman reported that the town was expecting an excellent day with new and exciting attractions, including the 'Beach at Bingham', new fairground rides, vintage vehicles, archery and displays of agricultural implements and model railway layouts in the marquee.

(c) I.C.T. (Information & Communication Technology)

The Bingham Business Club (B.B.C.) had been relaunched that morning at a successful breakfast meeting held at the Town Pavilion, Brendon Grove, attended by over forty businesses. Regular breakfast meetings would be held on the fourth Tuesday of the month between 8.00 and 9.00 a.m. at the Pavilion. Lunchtime meetings would also be held at The Chesterfield Arms on Church Street.

The Town Council was pleased that the B.B.C. had opened up its membership to all businesses in Bingham and the Vale of Belvoir.

The Town Council was keen to work closely with both the Borough and B.B.C. in order to develop a business directory for the town and to seek sponsorship for the Town Council's website.

A representative from the B.B.C. would be invited to the next meeting of the Community Committee.

The two annual Fairs held in Bingham were now firmly established and attracted people from a wide area, benefiting local businesses and the town in general.

Sponsorship would help secure business for the whole town.
