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8.00 **TOWN NEWS:**

A letter had been received from St. Mary's Church, confirming that the cost of distributing the Town News through the Butter Cross had risen to £90.00 per month. 10.00 **CORRESPONDENCE:**

01 Letter from Paul Smith

This referred to theft from a garden and the issue of scrap dealers. The Clerk had reported the incident to the police who confirmed that they were aware of the previous incident referred to in the letter.

02 Letter from a Resident

A letter had been received suggesting that the Health Centre should be built on the Sercon site and a probable new Tesco store built on the site proposed for the Health Centre. The Town Clerk had acknowledged the letter.

03 Letter from Police

This related to shed break-ins and thefts from allotments. An initiative had been proposed whereby the police were offering Selectamark and Smart Water kits at a cost of £8.00 to mark power tools, rotavators, lawnmowers and other household items. An article, along with contact details, in this respect had been placed in the Town News.
