### (c) Health Centre

The Town Council is disappointed to report the cancellation of a meeting by the P.C.T. at very short notice.

Doctors would like to pursue the development of their own site but are dependent on views of the other partner organisations.

(d) Rushcliffe Borough Council Parish/Town Council Forum - 'Big Society', 21<sup>st</sup> September, 2010.

Councillors Purdue-Horan and Mrs. M. Stockwood attended this event at which the Big Lottery was represented. There was a possibility that the Borough may not have received its share of lottery funding. It was indicated that funding may be available if the Town Council wished to develop the community building project and found that partners were not forthcoming. It was pointed out that, following cuts proposed by Nottinghamshire County Council, viability of local services such as the library may be under threat and the Town Council should monitor developments closely.

### 3.00 PROMOTION ISSUES:

### 01 Report of the Promotions Working Group

Preparations were underway for the Christmas Fair. Stalls were being booked on a first-come, first-served basis. An urban artist would be booked to decorate panels on Santa's grotto with a festive scene, and the cost of this would be borne from the Divisional Fund of Borough Councillors Mrs. M.
