2.00 <u>TYTHBY ROAD PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE - PRESENTATION BY</u> <u>PAUL HILLIER, N.C.C</u>:

Paul Hillier was welcomed to the meeting by the Chairman. He went on to present details of the proposals for improvements to the Tythby Road bridge. Nottinghamshire County Council had received the sum of £320,000 as part of the development process for improvement schemes directly related to access to the Mill Hill site from the town centre. The Town Council had requested a contribution to improve the safety of the bridge.

Following consultation with Development Control, Rushcliffe Borough Council, and Nottinghamshire County Council conducted a feasibility study, requesting the engineers to consider improving pedestrian access to the bridge. From several options originally considered, a preference was agreed for the construction of two concrete, cantilevered walkways either side of the bridge to accommodate pedestrians. This would involve major structural work to the bridge, necessitating road closures and temporary closure of the Linear Park.

Further design/cost details needed to be confirmed before a final decision was reached.
