FIRST IMPRESSION	Generally Cemetery is tidy, well kept, strimmed, remedial work on trees evident, replacement Jubilee tree planted. Cemetery lodge in good repair due to new roof.

DETAILS	
Original section :	Headstone checks imperative on this section due to age of them. 1 particular old kerbset has deteriorated & kerbs require repositioning but not dangerous. This was identified a few years ago by previous Clerk & necessary notice erected but no work has been undertaken. Old regulations apply and consequently the memorials are not necessarily anchored but that does not mean to say they are dangerous. Memorials are inspected and appropriate action taken as deemed necessary. Relatively new CWG memorial "Baggins/Buggins" has been referred back to CWGC as there was a large chip at top right hand corner.
New extension:	No immediate problems identified. Any concerns re headstones referred immediately to stonemason who addresses the problem. Land drains which run below ground along cemetery present problems when digging graves during a period of wet weather as they run through some of the graves & once breached the grave floods. No plans of where the drains actually run & appears inconsistent therefore never know when there will be a problem.
Garden of Rest	No immediate problems identified. Any queries are addressed as appropriate.
Additonal comments	Cemetery lodge recently had a new electric meter fitted. BTC trailer which is normally stored at Cemetery stolen 17/18 th March 2015. Trees on boundary have been addressed and to date no others identified as being a problem. To the best of my knowledge no major problems at the cemetery.
