Introduction

Bingham is an expanding market town which lies some eight miles to the east of Nottingham on the edge of the picturesque Vale of Belvoir. It is also within easy reach of Nottingham, Grantham, Newark, Melton Mowbray and Leicester with rail links to Skegness. In 2013 Bingham was voted as the best place in England and Wales to raise a family.

Bingham has a wide variety of independent shops and businesses offering high quality goods and friendly service. The majority are centrally located around and just off the Market Place.

Bingham became a market town in 1314. The Market Place, which is the focal point of the town centre, features the Butter Cross. Most of the building around the market square dates from the 1700s and early 1800s. Off the Market Place, Church Street leads to the 13th century parish Church of St Mary and All Saints, the oldest building in Bingham.

The town was a largely agricultural community and in 1851 the population was about 2,000. As the agricultural economy began to fail, people left Bingham to find work, the town eventually becoming a dormitory for Nottingham. After 1950, the town was targeted for considerable expansion and the population now stands at just under 10,000 and is a district centre in Rushcliffe.

The Butter Cross marks the site where farmers' wives would sit and display their baskets of butter and cheese some 200 years ago. Today a market is held every Thursday and a farmers' market every month, with other various specialist markets and events throughout the year.

Bingham Town Council





T is a little over two years since the last edition of the Town Guide and in that time the Town Council has quietly gone about its work from its base at the Old Court House which is at the eastern end of the Market Square heading out toward St Mary's and All Saints Church.

Bingham Council came about because of the Local Government Act of 1894 and as a corporate body it has an unbroken history as the first tier of local government for the town.

The Town Council via its staff or its contractors deliver events and services and in conjunction with partners such as local interest groups, the Emergency Services and the Borough and County Council work collaboratively to deliver and protect local amenities, and enhance the visual and friendly character that defines Bingham - so that as well as serving its residents it continues to draw residents from neighbouring rural villages because it acts as a local hub for facilities and services.

The Town Council has a management role or a level of responsibility for the provision and maintenance at the following locations:

- Play Parks at Carnarvon; Crow Close; Wallenfels; Wychwood, Wynhill
- The Linear Park nature reserve aided by our collaboration with the Friends of Bingham Linear Park
- Hill Drive Allotments
- The former Allotments to the north of the railway track which is being considered for long term car parking
- Amenity land such as the Soundbund as well as smaller pockets of land
- Warner's Paddock which is leased to a long-standing tenant
- The Sports Pavilion and sports pitches at Butt Field which are lease managed to the Bingham Town Sports Club who maximise the use of the site for croquet, cricket and multiple football formats
- The Town Pavilion and sports pitches at Wynhill which are lease managed to the Rugby Club Committee who offer various formats of rugby and offers room hire as well as consenting to storage for the 1st Bingham Scouts

- The Old Court House which as well as being the base for the Town Council is leased to tenants and provides room rental to several groups who support local groups or provide outreach services to the community.
- Grounds maintenance of St Mary's and All Saints closed churchyard
- The cemetery for burials, internment of ashes and memorial vaults as the Town Council is the burial authority; as well as the upkeep of the cemetery From a general amenities

perspective, the Town Council also has responsibility or part responsibility or acts as an agency service for:

- A sizeable arboreal portfolio across the town including trees within the Conservation Area
- Summer floral displays around the town centre
- The provision and emptying of litter and dog bins
- The provision and maintenance of public seating
- Noticeboards to publish agendas and other Town Council business
- CCTV
- Grass verge cutting
- Maintenance of public rights of way such as Jebbs Lane The Town Council also

promotes a sense of place by:

 Organising the Summer and Christmas Fairs and hosts other events on the Market Place subject to the necessary permissions being obtained from the Borough Council

- Installing a Christmas light display
- Making grant aid provision in its budget in support of local community groups

The Town Council's strategic direction is set by 14 Councillors who are elected members who give their time for free. The Council is once again Conservative led, following the election of 5 Conservative Councillors at the by-elections in November and December 2017.

At January's Full Council meeting changes were made to the meeting frequency and the Committee structures. The changes have been published to the Town Council's website. Members of the public and press are welcome to attend all Council meetings including committee meetings. Agendas are published for Council meetings and committees meetings to the Town Council's noticeboards and to the website.

At the time of writing, the Council is working to identify its priorities and projects for the forthcoming financial year so that it can set its budget and submit its precept demand to the Borough Council. The Council's paid Officers and support staff implement the decisions made by Council. The team consists of full-time Grounds and Maintenance men and part-time staff who include the Town Clerk, Deputy Clerk, Administrative Assistants as well as our cleaner.

Bingham Linear Park

n 2001, Bingham Town Council commissioned a professional ecology organisation to provide a management plan for the Linear Park, which comprises a length of disused railway from Nottingham Road to the River Smite. The objective of the report was to maintain and enhance the conservation value of the site, which includes extensive, valuable, species-rich grassland, where a number of locally rare species of plants and insects survive.

A group of volunteers, called 'The Friends of Bingham Linear Park', was formed in September 2002, with the aim of implementing the recommendations of the report.

Bedward II granted the original Market Charter to the Lady of the Manor, Alice de Byngham in 1314. It is likely that the market existed before that date, with the charter merely legalising an already established event. The market fell into disuse at the end of the 19th century and was re-opened in its present form in 1975. During holiday periods the market is often enlivened by street entertainment and activities to give families an opportunity to come and enjoy the facilities – look out for future advertisements.

With markets providing a popular draw for visitors, they are also a sign of a thriving town and Bingham market is no exception. 

Bingham Children's Centre is based in the same premises shared with Bingham Library and is one of the Children's Centre hubs that the Rushcliffe district staff team work from. The service is commissioned (paid for) by Nottinghamshire County Council, Nottinghamshire Children and Families Partnership (NCFP), who are a combination of Nottinghamshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust, Family Action and North Notts College. are responsible for running all the Sure Start Children's Centres in Nottinghamshire.

Our Aims

A Children's Centre is a place, or group of places, where local families with young children can go and enjoy facilities and receive support



if needed. Sometimes support may be offered in the home and in groups and activities delivered in community settings. The facilities and activities are designed especially for parents expecting a baby, or those with a child under 5 years old and are a great way to meet new people too.

The main aim of Children's Centres is to improve outcomes for all young children, so that they are happy, healthy and ready for school. We want to provide help and support to young children and families as soon as there is a need, helping to prevent any problems

Bingham Heritage Trails Association



BHTA is a registered charity with a remit to increase public awareness of Bingham's heritage. Since 2000, BHTA has carried out several Lottery-funded projects, the results of which have been published in posters, leaflets, two books, Bingham Back in Time and People and Places, academic articles and on the BHTA website. BHTA also holds open, free, public lectures each winter and publishes a free quarterly newsletter. Members give talks and guided walks around Bingham on invitation to local schools, clubs and societies.

A free illustrated Bingham Heritage Trail for adults and Bingham Tour Guide for Kids, and the newsletter can be obtained at the Town Office and Bingham Library. The website, www.binghamheritage.org.uk is the Association's main contact with the public, and contains detailed information on all the completed projects.

A project to investigate the involvement of people from Bingham in the First World War was completed in 2017. We are planning a major community event to commemorate the centenary of the end of the War, in partnership with the British Legion, the Town Council and others.

Since 2004 BHTA has carried out two major archaeological projects. The first included field

walking all the arable land in the parish and was finished in 2010. The second, finished in 2017. involved digging 70 one-metre test pits in gardens in central Bingham and doing tree-ring dating on a number of old houses. These projects demonstrated that the parish has been inhabited for around 8,000 vears and that the historic centre of Bingham around the church has been an area settlement since the Iron Age. Indeed there was a Roman house on Cherry Street. The village itself probably came into existence in the 9th and 10th centuries. Before that people lived in small farms and settlements scattered around the parish including the area near the church. The village was well established by the time of the Norman Conquest, Apart from the church (1225AD) no medieval buildings have survived. The oldest house in Bingham has been dated to the early 1600s, but other houses have been built around cores from the 17th century or earlier and some oak timbers have been found in them that may have been recycled from early medieval buildings.

Membership, which costs £2 per annum, is open to anybody over 18.


